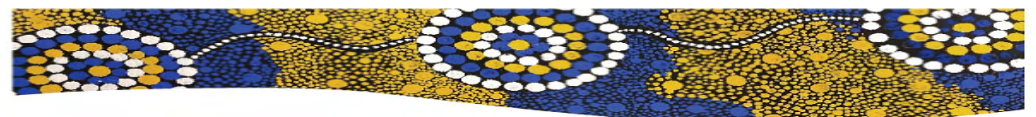

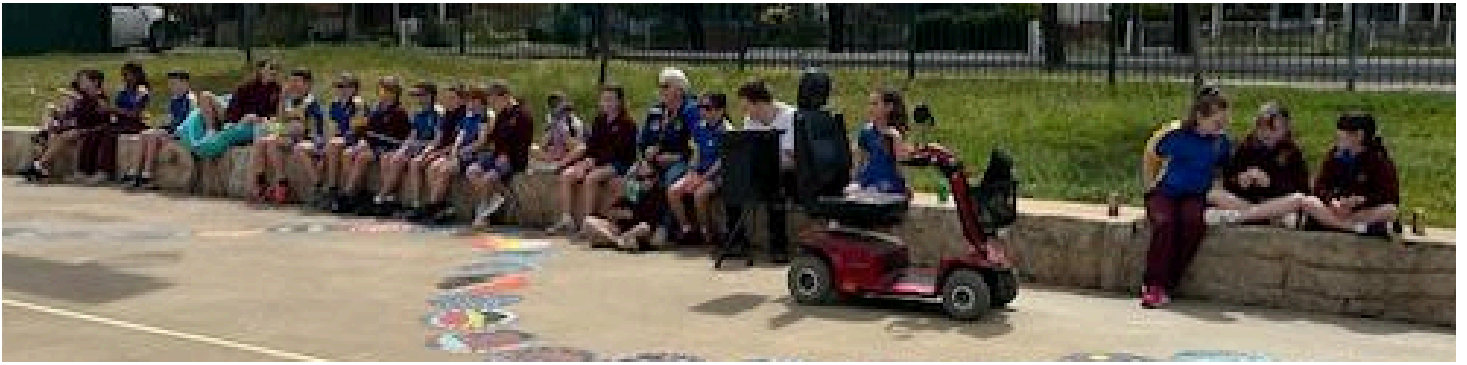

Topics cover content such as gratitude, dealing with disappointment, friendships, courage, hope, resilience, climate change, grief and empathy.

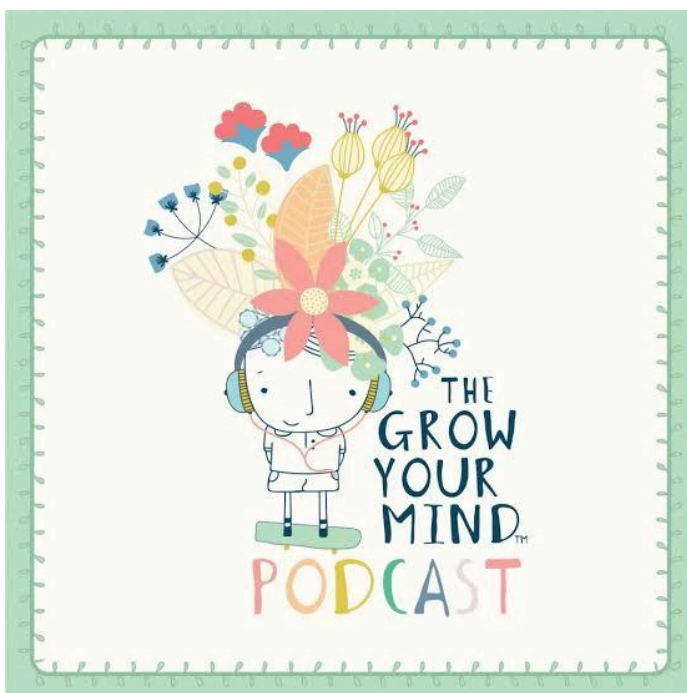
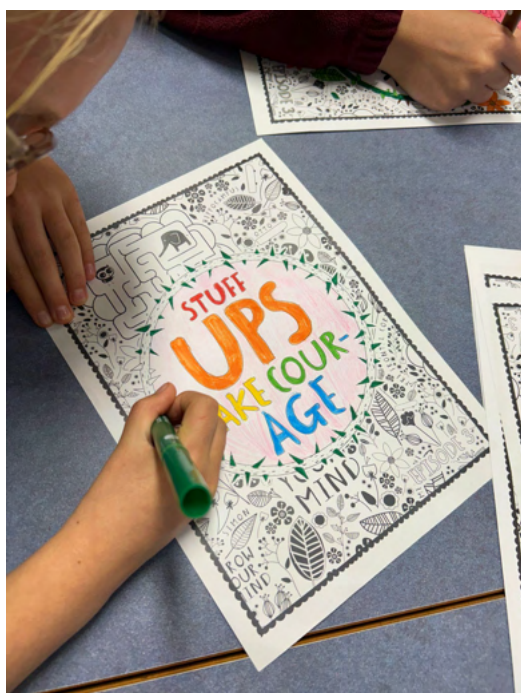
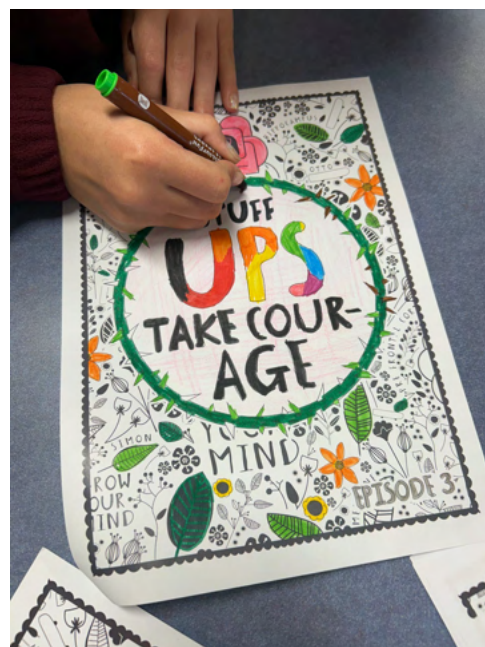
It has been great to see boys and girls give it a go to see what it is all about! (There may have been chocolate at one session ..but don't tell anyone!).

## ST MARY'S NAIDOC

### Lemon Myrtle cookies

#### Ingredient's

- 125 gm unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 80 gm caster sugar
- 3 drops Lemon myrtle essence
- 115 gm self-raising flour
- 100 gm plain flour
- 2 tbsp milk

#### Method

- Line 2 baking trays with baking paper, pre-heat oven 160°C
- With an electric beater whip butter, sugar, vanilla essence and the Lemon myrtle drops
- Sift both flours together in a bowl, add half of the flour mixture with a wooden spoon until combined. Then add milk and mix well
- Add the remaining flour and mix together with the wooden spoon, bring the mix together with your hands until it makes a soft dough. Add 1 tbs of milk if the mix is dry
- Roll the mix into round balls 4cm apart on the lined trays. You can flatten the cookie dough with the back of a fork
- They are ready to bake for 18-20mins, swap the trays halfway through the bake.
- Allow to cool for 3 minutes before placing on a cool rack.

- Vouchers can be downloaded as a QR code and used toward either an eligible physical or creative activity.
- The \$50 vouchers will be issued in school term 1 and school term 3.
- Vouchers must be redeemed before their expiry date.
