Welcome Back

Welcome back to all our wonderful Year 3-6 St Mary's students and staff. I hope everyone has had a refreshing and enjoyable break. For the first time in many years, we do not have any "fresh new faces" on our teaching staff. Some roles have changed and some staff are returning from a break, but all staff are familiar with the structures of St Mary's and ready to hit the ground running. It has been great to hear the buzz of the students in and around the school grounds again.

Pre-Assessments/ Diagnostic Testing

As part of the learning cycle, our Year 3-6 classes are using the first few weeks to knock over a few of the regular tasks that take place at the beginning of the school year, such as getting to know each other, completing title pages and setting up the class expectations and routines.

A number of pre-assessment tasks are also being completed during these initial weeks, especially in English and Math. These tasks allow staff to see where students are at, as well as allow them valuable data to review in staff meetings in order to make plans of how to best help our students with their individual learning needs throughout the year. Your students may have come home mentioning some of these assessments such as our Renaissance Star Reading Assessment (comprehension skills), DIBELS (reading skills and fluency) and Essential Assessment (Maths).

School Fees 2025

The Catholic Education Diocese of Bathurst is committed to providing quality Catholic education to all students in Diocesan schools. The Diocesan School Fee increase has been kept consistent with the recent CPI of 3.8% for 2025, whilst the 2025 Capital Works Levy per family has been limited to an increase of 2.5%. The School Fee increase has been set at a level that is consistent with current inflation rates but below significant cost increases experienced over recent years, particularly in the areas of materials, construction and wages. The 2025 School Fee increase equates to an average of \$1.48 per week for a primary student and \$2.81 per week for a secondary student for the 42 billing weeks of the school year.

Fee relief remains available for those parents who are facing financial hardship through the Catherine McAuley Bursary. If you have not done so already, please contact your school for a Fee Relief Application. There are also Health Care Card concessions for eligible parents. You may also contact the Fees Liaison Officer at Catholic Education Diocese of Bathurst at floceo@bth.catholic.edu.au for assistance with concessions. Please do not hesitate to discuss with your school principal the concessions available. Thank you for your ongoing support of Catholic Education at St Mary's.

Oval Improvements

Our school oval was levelled, irrigation installed and turf put in place during the school holidays. In a few weeks students will be able to re-enter this much improved space. Thanks to our groundsman John Walters for coordinating this project. During the holidays Mrs Whale painted activity stations in the K-2 area and we thank her for some amazing creative designs. Mrs Whale is also supporting students to plant a sensory garden for our students to interact with.





















Changes to Mobile Phone Policy 2025

In 2024 Year 7-10 students were allowed to store their mobile phones in their lockers and school bags for the day, turned off. Due to changes in policies across NSW schools and pending Government changes regarding age limits for social media platforms we will be changing our mobile phone processes in 2025. Students are to either leave their phones at home, or if they do bring a phone to the school it will be secured in the school office for the day. Under no circumstances are phones to be stored in personal lockers or school bags or be carried by students.

Expectations for Students

- 1. If a mobile phone or mobile device is brought to school, it must be turned off and secured in the student's bag until the Pastoral Care period. During pastoral care each morning, student devices will be collected and secured in the school office. **Note:** Smartwatches are not to be worn to school.
- 2. As devices are secure students should not have their mobile device with them in a classroom or on the playground during recess and lunch.
- 3. Students in K-6 who need to bring a mobile phone to school are to hand this to the class teacher each morning and collect it in the afternoon.
- **4.** At the end of the school day, students at the school bus stop may access their phone only to briefly check for a message from parents/carers and to respond appropriately.
- 5. Students are reminded that they should always adhere to diocesan and school policies regarding bullying and harassment. Bullying and harassment are never acceptable and electronic devices should never be used to bully or harass others.
- **6.** Students are responsible for care and security of their own electronic devices and St Mary's Catholic School is not responsible for damage or theft. Electronic devices are expensive items and each student makes their own choice knowing the risk of bringing them to school.

Library News

Welcome back to the Library for 2025. A very special welcome to our Kindergarten students and all our new St Mary's families. Students have been in and out of the library over the last two weeks borrowing books, checking out all the new items in our Cub Credit Shop and taking part in library lessons. Below is a timetable of when classes have their library lessons. If students in Kindergarten to Year 6 could please bring in a library bag (preferably waterproof) each week to lessons for borrowing and returning books. Students are encouraged to borrow two books each week. For our K-2 students they are asked to pick a book of their choice and also a reader (Kindergarten students will start off just picking 1 book of choice) and our Yr 3-6 students are asked to borrow a Renaissance book and another book of their choice. Mr Nugent and our secondary classes have been visiting the library this week too. Our secondary students are also being encouraged to pick two books, one a Renaissance book to read at school and the other a book of choice to read at home. It is vitally important that ALL students are dedicating time everyday to read at home and reading for a minimum of 20 minutes, however the more, the better!! The hope is that by setting up good reading practises, it will become a habit. But please don't stop there, reading together, reading aloud and having book conversations with children is just as important. Celebrate the small successes and encourage your child to persevere, even when they are frustrated. Reward your child's reading efforts and what better reward than a good book! While reading is a crucial life skill and delivers widereaching educational value to children, it doesn't have to be boring. On the contrary, it should be fun! Our ultimate aim by working together is to develop in students a love for reading.

Ways you can support student reading at home:

Have time each night designated for reading-

- Infants students- reading aloud home readers and reading with or listening to a book of choice
- Year 3 to Year 10- Renaissance reading (20-30mins) Before bed is the ideal time as helps relaxation

Book conversations-

- Infants readers have some great parent notes in the front and back of each book, including questions to ask after reading the story.
- Year 3 to Year 10 students- Ask them about the book they're currently reading, When they finish reading any book encourage them to jump on and see if it's on Renaissance and do the quiz, ask them about quiz results and what book they might read next? Talk about books you enjoy reading or loved at their age!

Encourage and reward-

Offer encouragement with reading, make it a fun and rewarding task.

- Infants students- After reading aloud to you, get them to pick a book they love for you to read to them (don't forget to use some crazy character voices!!) Picking a new book from the shops is a fantastic reward for reading successes!
- Year 3 to Year 10- not watching the movie, until they have read the book and making a fun night of it. Finding a
 series they love and buying the next book to keep them going, finding books you love and encouraging them to
 read it too and again books make a great reward!

Renaissance Reading

Renaissance Reading kicked off this week with our Yr 3-6 students sitting their Star Reading Assessments. These assessments provide teachers with a range of data in regards to how students are performing with reading. This assessment also provides students with their ZPD levels (Zone of Proximal Development), they then use their given zone to pick a book from the Renaissance section of the library. I've attached at the end of this newsletter a flyer that explains what Renaissance Reading is and how we're using it at St Mary's. If you use the QR code on the flyer there is a video of myself explaining Renaissance Reading. This video was made a couple of years ago but is still very relevant and is a great introduction to Renaissance Reading.

Details to order online are on the back page of the catalogue. If you are having any difficulties with orders, please contact the school. Issue 1 orders are due next Thursday, February 20.



Cybersafety

We are increasingly dealing with social media and cybersafety issues at school with **over 90%** of these incidents occurring out of school hours. We ask you as parents to regularly check your child's social media access and to monitor the Apps accessed and who they are contacting. **Please note that Snap Chat and Tik Tok (and numerous other sites) should not be used by children under 13 years of age in Australia.**

If your child is a victim of misuse of technology this is what we recommend that you do:

- Save and store the offending material on your computer, mobile phone or other device
- Print a copy of the material and immediately report the incident to the school
- If the material is pornographic or sexualised immediately report this to the police

School Travel Passes

Applications are now open for 2025 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel.

Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. Note: Some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.

School Uniform

- All students should be wearing full summer uniforms in Term 1.
- SMCS blue bucket hats for all students (no maroon hats please) / Year 7-10 only optional SMCS baseball hat.
- Sport uniform will be worn 3 days a week / official school uniform 2 days a week as below:
 K-6 wear sports uniform on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday
 7-10 wear sports uniforms on Monday, Thursday and Friday

Reminder - Parking At The Front of School

We ask that all our parents, carers and visitors to the school adhere to our parking regulations to keep our children safe.

- Avoid parallel parking/ double parking or asking your child to cross the road unassisted
- Do not park across or in the disability parking spaces unless you display a disabled permit
- Do not park in bus zones during bus service times

These restrictions are required to maximise parking opportunities for everyone and to keep children safe.

The new gate has been installed near the K-2 play equipment for parents to have access for drop offs and pickups. This will ease the congestion at the front of the school.

Parents are asked to ensure younger siblings do not play on the play equipment.

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





A Parent's Guide to Accelerated Reader

Renaissance Reading is a reading program that helps teachers manage and monitor children's independent reading practice. Your child picks a book at his/her own level and reads it at their own pace. When finished, your child takes a short quiz on the computer - passing the quiz is an indication that your child has understood what has been read.











How can I support my child become a better reader?

As with anything, performance improves with practice. Research suggests, students who read at least 20 minutes a day see the greatest gains. Encourage your child to read at home, discuss books and ask questions about what they have read.
