
Save the Date - Taste of St Mary's / Elective Information Evening - Wednesday 28 August

Feast of the Assumption 15 August

Feast of the Assumption of Mary

Thursday this week marked the commemoration of the death of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which is known as the Assumption, because of the tradition that her body did not decay but that she was raised up, body and soul, into heaven. This tradition was already present in the sixth century; by the beginning of the twentieth century it was widespread; and after consulting the views of bishops all over the world, the Pope formally and infallibly declared the doctrine of the Assumption to be part of the authentic and ancient doctrine of the universal Church.

Note that an "assumption" is different from an "ascension". One is passive (i.e. one is assumed) and the other is active (i.e. one ascends). It is by the power of God that Mary was assumed.

A few points to note:

- At no time in history has Christendom venerated a grave or tomb of the Blessed Virgin.
- Until the 5th century of Christianity, there was not even a legend concerning her place of burial.
- There is absolutely no relic of Our Lady's body in existence; nor has any person or city ever claimed possession of such a relic. From the earliest times of the Church, the faithful venerated the remains of the Saints. Relics of the Apostles and of thousands of martyrs are preserved in shrines and caskets. The sacred remains of Mary could not have been lost or neglected.
- In the first sixteen centuries of Christianity, no reputable theologian or school of theology ever questioned the dogma of the Assumption.


How to read the NAPLAN individual student report

Are you a parent or carer of a student in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 who took the NAPLAN assessment in March? If so, you will have received an individual student report of your child's results last week.

These reports provide useful information on a student's achievement in reading, writing, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. You can use the NAPLAN individual student report to discuss your child's progress with their teacher.

- Pregnant women at any stage of pregnancy
- Aboriginal people aged 6 months and over
- Anyone aged 65+
- People with serious health conditions, including heart disease, chronic lung conditions (including severe asthma), kidney, and liver disease and diabetes.


Book Week


Book Fair Orders




Aboriginal Education






Reminder - Parking At The Front of School

2024 School Fee Information

The Catholic Education Diocese of Bathurst is committed to providing quality Catholic education to all students in Diocesan schools. In 2024 the Diocesan School Fee increase has been limited to 2.5% for 2024, whilst the 2024 Capital Works Levy per family has been kept at 2022 and 2023 levels. The School Fee increase has been set at a level that recognises the current cost of living pressures being experienced by our families, including high inflation and rising interest rates. The increase is well below current inflation levels of 5.2%, but has been set to balance the upward inflationary pressure on our costs and the expected decrease in government funding levels into the future.

Fee relief remains available for those parents who are facing financial hardship. If you have not done so already, please contact your school for a Fee Relief Application. There are also Health Care Card concessions for eligible parents. You may also contact the Fees Liaison Officer at Catholic Education Diocese of Bathurst at floceo@bth.catholic.edu.au for assistance with concessions. Please do not hesitate to discuss with your school principal the concessions available. Thank you for your ongoing support of Catholic Education at St Mary's.

Active and Creative Kids Voucher

The new Active and Creative Kids voucher is now available, helping to make activities more affordable for eligible NSW families. Families of eligible school-aged children will be able to use two \$50 vouchers per calendar year.

- Vouchers are available to those receiving **Family Tax Benefit Part A**, or **Family Tax Benefit Part B**, or both.
- Vouchers can be downloaded as a QR code and used toward either an eligible physical or creative activity.
- The \$50 vouchers will be issued in school term 1 and school term 3.
- Vouchers must be redeemed before their expiry date.


