DIBELS Short-term Reading Initiative

Over the past few months, a number of students from Kindergarten to Year 8 were involved in a short-term reading program based on the structures and implementation of the DIBELs reading program. DIBELS reading assessments, focus on reading skills such as letter and sound recognition, fluency, accuracy and correct word usage. Data was collected last week and shared as part of our weekly staff meeting. The student growth over the 7 week period was **fantastic** and demonstrated the benefits of focused learning and engagement. Thank you to all staff and parents who provided resources, time and encouragement to make the initiative so successful. We look forward to running the program again throughout 2025.

Student Assessments

Over the coming weeks, staff will be finalising their assessments of student skills and knowledge for each of the Key Learning Areas. Primary classes do not have a designated assessment week, rather teachers collect data and results in a variety of ways throughout the term.

Cybersafety


We are increasingly dealing with social media and cybersafety issues at school with **over 90%** of these incidents occurring out of school hours. We ask you as parents to regularly check your child's social media access and to monitor the Apps accessed and who they are contacting. **Please note that Snap Chat and Tik Tok (and numerous other sites) should not be used by children under 13 years of age in Australia.**

If your child is a victim of misuses of technology this is what we recommend that you do:

- Save and store the offending material on your computer, mobile phone or other device
- Print a copy of the material and immediately report the incident to the school
- If the material is pornographic or sexualised immediately report this to the police

Nine different species of microbats were found in St Mary's, including the Large Bent-winged Bat and Yellow-bellied Sheath-tailed Bat both vulnerable to extinction. School Travel Passes

Applications are now open for 2025 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel.


Students living in rural and regional areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. Note: Some rural and regional operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct.</u> The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.


