

DIBELS Short-Term Learning Initiative

At St Mary's, we use a number of formative assessments throughout the year to assess and inform the learning of our students. One of these is the DIBELS Assessment (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills). The DIBELS assessment is conducted three times a year and allows staff to test a range of literacy skills and monitor student growth. The assessment is conducted in all grades from Kindergarten to Year 8.

Next week, a number of students in Kinder to Year 8 will begin a short, 6 week "booster" session, aimed at honing in on some of the literacy skills assessed in DIBELS. All parents can assist in the building of their child's literacy skills by continuing to encourage reading at home and aiming to assist their children with any sight word or fluency activities that may come home as homework.



Showcasing St Mary's


Thursday 12 September


















Learning Walk

Cyber Education



Flu Vaccinations

The 2024 flu vaccine is available now. Influenza (flu) is serious, but your yearly flu vaccine offers the best protection against getting really sick - so you can keep doing the things you love.

Getting a flu vaccine is quick, easy and recommended for everyone aged 6 months, and is free for:

- Children aged 6 months to under 5 years
- Pregnant women at any stage of pregnancy
- Aboriginal people aged 6 months and over
- Anyone aged 65+
- People with serious health conditions, including heart disease, chronic lung conditions (including severe asthma), kidney, and liver disease and diabetes.

Book your flu vaccine today with your doctor, local pharmacy or Aboriginal Medical Service (AMS) through healthdirect.gov.au/nswfluvaccine.

Everyone aged 5 years and older can get vaccinated at their local pharmacy.

Reminder - Parking At The Front of School

We ask that all our parents, carers and visitors to the school adhere to our parking regulations to keep our children safe.

- Avoid parallel parking/ double parking or asking your child to cross the road unassisted
- Do not park across or in the disability parking spaces unless you display a disabled permit
- Do not park in bus zones during bus service times

These restrictions are required to maximise parking opportunities for everyone and to keep children safe. During the school holidays we had a new gate installed near the K-2 play equipment for parents to have access for drop offs and pickups. We hope this will be operational soon. Active and Creative Kids Voucher

The new Active and Creative Kids voucher is now available, helping to make activities more affordable for eligible NSW families. Families of eligible school-aged children will be able to use two \$50 vouchers per calendar year.

- Vouchers are available to those receiving <u>Family Tax Benefit Part A</u>, or <u>Family Tax Benefit Part B</u>, or both.
- Vouchers can be downloaded as a QR code and used toward either an eligible physical or creative activity.
- The \$50 vouchers will be issued in school term 1 and school term 3.
- Vouchers must be redeemed before their expiry date.
