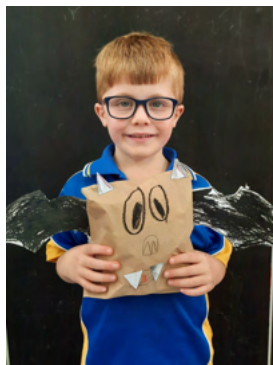
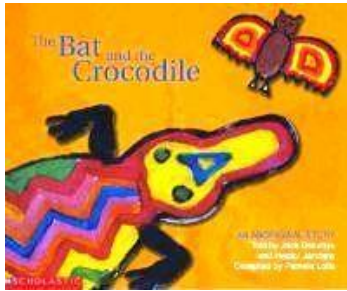


Library News

Thank you to all students who have shared their favourite book in library lessons over the past few weeks. It's wonderful to see students eager to share and enjoy books together!



Last week, in Library lessons we celebrated National Indigenous Literacy Day. Indigenous Literacy Day aims to advocate, promote and celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture stories and language. Students enjoyed hearing the Dreamtime story 'The Bat and the Crocodile' and learning some Wiradjuri words such as Giilang- which means story. We also created some bat-tastic artworks.



We have definitely been going a little bit 'batty' in the library at the moment, with students researching and studying bats. Earlier this year, Mid Macquarie Landcare placed a special box in one of the trees at our school. This box collects bat signals and allows researchers to examine what bats are in our area and also the amount of activity over a period of time. Students were intrigued and wanted to learn more, so we have been developing our research skills in lessons and trying to gather as much information on bats that we can. We have already discovered so many interesting facts about bats. Did you know?

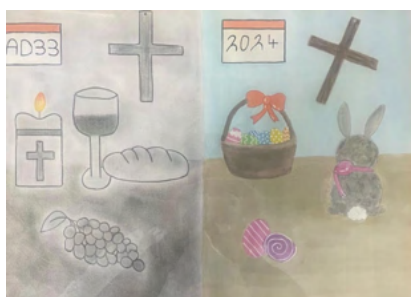
- *Bats are the only mammal that flies.*
- *Bats can sleep not only upside down but also standing up or sideways*
- *The Flying Fox is the largest species of bat. Its wingspan can measure up to 1.8m*
- *The smallest bat is the Bumblebee Bat. It's body measures about 2.5cm and weighs about 2 grams*

NAIDOC, NAIDOC, NAIDOC-

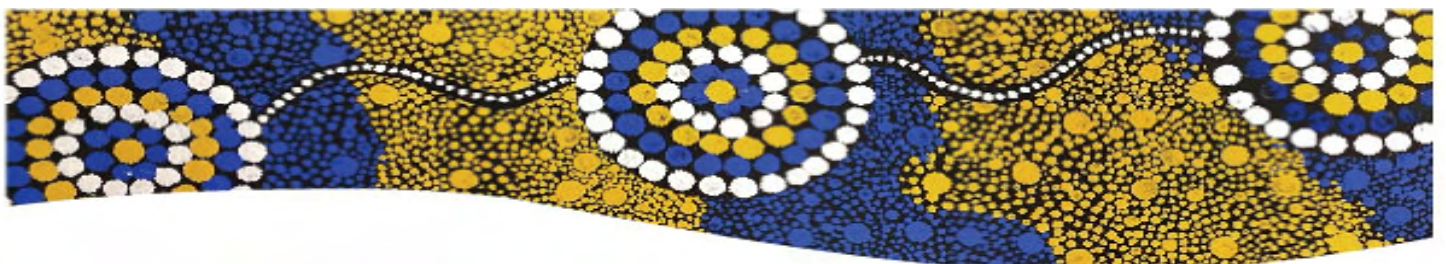
This week Mrs Sears and Ms Hodges have been very busy continuing the sharing of Aboriginal education and Binjang culture.

Reminder - Parking At The Front of School

- **Avoid parallel parking/ double parking or asking your child to cross the road unassisted**

- Vouchers are available to those receiving **Family Tax Benefit Part A**, or **Family Tax Benefit Part B**, or both.
- Vouchers can be downloaded as a QR code and used toward either an eligible physical or creative activity.
- The \$50 vouchers will be issued in school term 1 and school term 3.
- Vouchers must be redeemed before their expiry date.

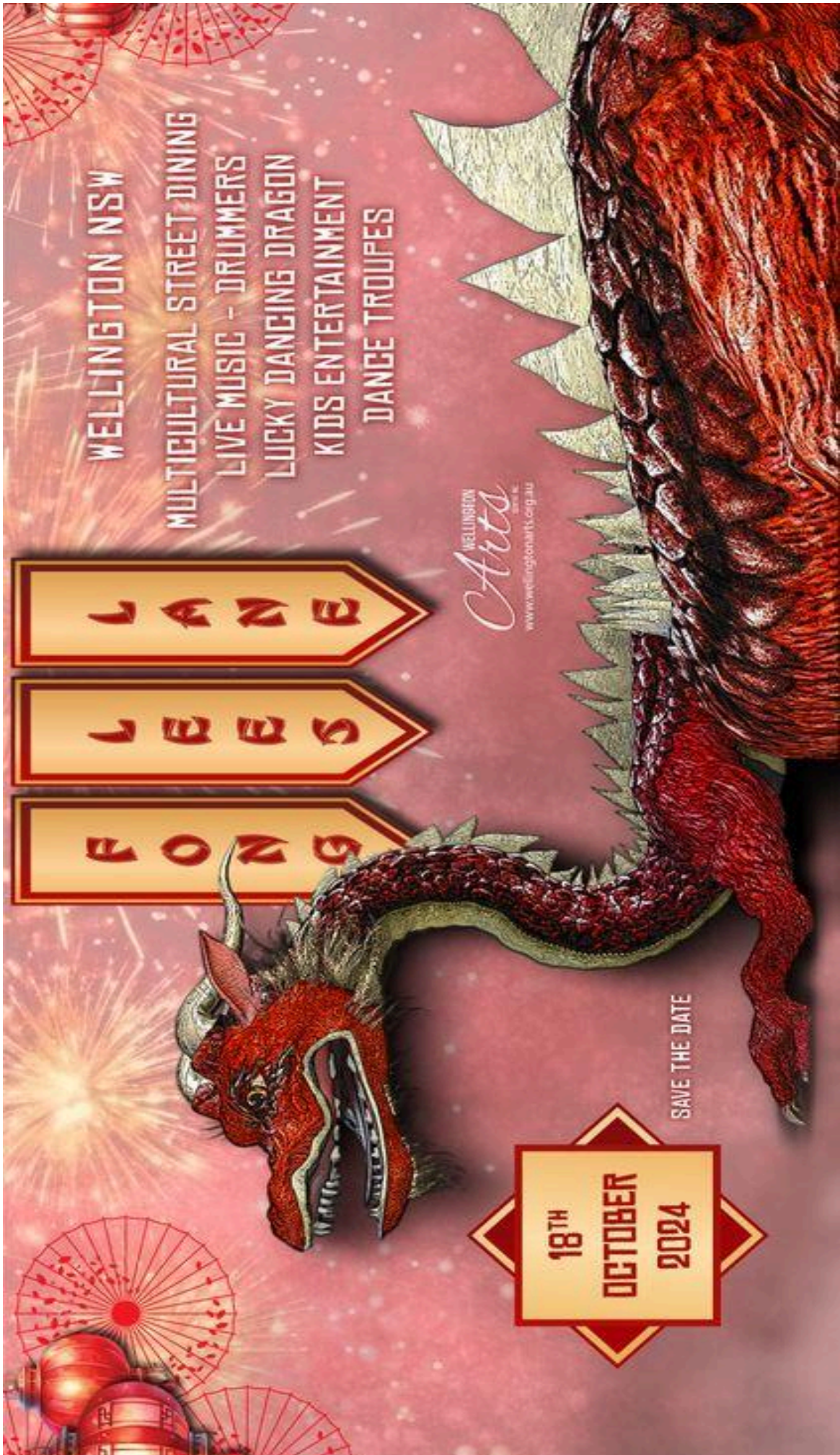
